LIKE CHASING THE WIND

"... FINDING MEANING BEYOND THE SUN"

Life can **feel like** an **endless chase**—repeating routines and chasing satisfaction that never lasts. **Ecclesiastes** exposes the emptiness of life "under the sun," but **points us to Jesus**, who stepped into our world **to bring true meaning, joy, and purpose**. In Him, everything changes.

WEEK 1 - "The Endless Chase"

Introduction:

On Sunday we heard that life can often *feel like* an "*endless chase*"—the same routines, the same struggles, and the same questions about meaning. *Solomon's words* remind us that everything "*under the sun*" is fleeting, like *breath* or vapor. But in Christ, God stepped into our endless cycle to bring us true and lasting life!

Read Together: Ecclesiastes 1:1-11 AND 2 Corinthians 5:17

What stands out to you from these passages or from what we heard on Sunday?

Look at the passages and discuss the following questions...

- 1. What examples does **Solomon give** to show how repetitive life can be?
- 2. Why does Solomon conclude that "nothing is new under the sun"?
- 3. What are some "endless chases" we fall into today?
- 4. How does **Jesus make our ordinary lives** meaningful?
- 5. How does 2 Corinthians 5:17 reshape the way we view our routines?

Bonus Question (if you have time) – Look at John 3:3-8... what is it telling us?
