# WEEK 4 - "Oppression, Toil & Friendless-ness"

#### Introduction:

On Sunday we heard that Ecclesiastes 4 confronts us with people suffering under oppression, striving out of envy, and living in deep loneliness with no one to comfort them. Yet we also heard that **Jesus**—the Prince of Peace—enters our broken world with justice, mercy, and companionship, fulfilling the hope that "two are better than one" as 'Emmanuel', **the Friend who never leaves** us.

**Before you begin** – "Why do you think people today are more connected than ever, yet often feel more lonely than ever?" ...discuss and then **pray** together!

Read again: Ecclesiastes 4:1–16; 5:8–9

What stands out to you from these passages or from what we heard on Sunday?

## **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. Look at **Ecclesiastes 4**:1–3. What stands out to you about Solomon's description of **oppression** and the *lack of comfort*? What do you think makes people feel unseen or unsupported in our culture?
- 2. Read Ecclesiastes 4:4. Why does Solomon say much human work is motivated by envy? Where do you see this in today's world?
- **3.** Looking at Ecclesiastes 4:7–8. What does Solomon reveal about the emptiness of isolated, self-focused living?
- 4. What truths does Ecclesiastes 4:9–12 teach about the strength and blessing of companionship?
- 5. Instead of *despairing at the oppression* Solomon saw, how does seeing yourself as a new creation in Christ, *change the way you interpret* the injustice and brokenness described in Ecclesiastes 4?
- **6.** Solomon saw **toil driven by envy**. What does it look like to live free from comparison because your identity is **secure** in Christ? (Look at Matt.6:19-21)

**Ecclesiastes** exposes life's emptiness *without* God, but **Jesus restores** justice, community, and purpose for us **as new creations**. Let's pray for His strength to live it out. ...extra verse to look at **Micah 6:8** & **John 13:34–35**
